

DEPARTMENT ACCOMPLISHMENTS:

Counseling Department

Military Day took place on December 4, 2024, with the Army, National Guard, and Marines participating.

English Department

Mathematics Department

Barb Wieteszka administered the Third New Jersey Math League Contest on 12/17/24. Aaditya Aiyer received a perfect score of 6/6. Austin Keeth, Diego Gonzales, Zachary Beers, Nicholas Simeon, and Daphne Roskowski scored a 5/6.

- Barb Wieteszka administered the Fourth New Jersey Math League Contest on 1/14/25. Fiona Cusack, Aidan McLaughlin, Austin Keeth, Yoel Samoun, Hope Dunleavy, and Jaden Vega scored a 5/6.
- Barbara Wieteszka's AP Statistics students completed a Critical Statistical Analysis Project on aspects of a survey administration. They utilized the objectives and standards from chapter 4 to complete their analysis.
- Using objectives learned in Chapter 3, students completed a project to figure out what the asking price of a car of their choice would be that was in fair condition.
- Aniela Huizenga's ADV Algebra 2 students completed a poster project on exponential growth and decay. Students created or researched a real-world scenario related to exponential functions and modeled it with a graph, equation, and table.
- Matt Evancho's ADV Discrete students worked with experimental and theoretical probability with sums of rolling a pair of dice.
 - In ADV Pre Calc, Aniela Huizenga had students complete special right triangle activities and guided discovery to help students discover the angle measures and ordered pairs of the unit circle.
 - In CP Geometry, Nicholas Perkalis had his students use straws to prove theorems of congruency within triangles. He also had his students complete proof posters, demonstrating their knowledge of proofs and logical thinking in a creative poster/display.
- In AP Calculus AB, Nicholas Perkalis had his students demonstrate their knowledge of optimization by discovering the maximum volume that can be created by making an open top box from a single sheet of computer paper.

Karine Polgar had her CP Algebra 1A students complete a poster project on solving inequalities.

Practical Arts

Kelsey Collins' Interior Design students worked on a special project: redesigning the VHS teacher's faculty lounge. Teachers were asked to provide the students with preferences and ideas for the redesign. Their responses were both thoughtful, inspiring, and valuable in helping the students grow as designers!

Per Mrs. Collins, "To see the range of creativity in the students' designs was very exciting! Some concepts were especially imaginative, while others worked within the current setup, highlighting how functional the lounge already is. Interestingly, all students agreed that the mailboxes should be mounted on the wall right when you walk into the room." Approximate costs were calculated for the redesign by some students. All in all, this was a highly effective and enjoyable student assignment!
