6. Public Hearing and Adoption of the 2024-2025 School Year Budget

6.1. Public hearing presentation on the 2024-2025 school year budget presented by Kathryn Blew, School Business Administrator.

Board member Brendan McIsaac commented on the cycle of reductions in state funding and whether any forecast is known for future state aid. K. Blew noted that although the District is in its final year of this reduction in state funding cycle, the District did receive an increase this year. Going forward, the District will continue to rely on the formula provided by the state for funding, knowing that the formula has never been fully funded.

8. Chief School Administrator's Report

Assistant Superintendent R. Bergacs provided the Chief School Administrator's Report:

 Finals. They finished ranking 8th. It was the first time in school history that the
 Jazz Ensemble participated in the preliminary round for the NJAJE State Finals,
 so to finish ranking 8th in Group II finals is one for the school history books.

11. Evaluation of Library Material per Policy 9130:

Board discussion of NHHS Reconsideration Committee's report of the library book "Let's Talk About It" by Erika Moen and Matthew Nolan, following the submission of a public complaint on 2/13/2024, in accordance with Policy 9130.

Student board alternate Jude Gepp shared their opinion as well as student feedback they have received from peers regarding the book challenge. Board members expressed their opinions and discussion ensued with references to the NJ state obscenity law, the Miller Test, professional reviews, parental rights and potential parental restrictions.

Motion by N. Gallo and second by C. Reyes to remove the book based on violation of the New Jersey obscenity law. Motion failed based on roll call vote, with weighted votes of "no" totalling 7 from B. Chapman (.9), T. Hintz (1.2), B. Kotran (.9), B. McIsaac (.9), J. Melick (.8), D. Spanton (.9), and G. Farbanish (1.4). Weighted votes of "yes" totaling 4.1 from K. Cagno (.8), N. Gallo (1.2), C. Reyes (.9), K. Solino (1.2).

12. Curriculum, Instruction and Technology - Committee Report

- Curriculum, Instruction & Technology agenda items reviewed and recommended for approval
- Staff summer curriculum hours are planned for summer work on curriculum and College Board revisions to AP courses
- Committee discussed more consistency among the classes in weighting for common assessments
- Our District Technology Coordinator, G. Vargas-Dellacasa, met with the committee for a discussion on Artificial Intelligence (AI). Discussion and plans for implementation of AI in the curriculum and potential policy will continue.

13. **Policy and School Security** - Committee Report

- The Books/Materials Reconsideration Form was reviewed and the title revised to include Instructional as well as Resource materials, keeping in alignment with the regulation language. Both schools are named on the form making it universal for the district.
- NJSBA conversion to the policy manual is underway between the administrative team and NJSBA representatives. NJSBA will provide the new manual upon completion of the conversion. The process for adoption of the entire policy manual is being determined.
- Cell phone reception at VHS has areas with poor reception varying by cell carrier.

14. Finance, Facilities and Transportation - Committee Report

- The committee reviewed the budget and next steps. A Bill has been proposed that would allow NJ municipalities to raise taxes up to the amount that equals state funding lost over the S2 budget reduction years. The current budget has been developed without consideration of this pending bill.
- Capital project to replace classroom doors that do not meet safety requirements is moving forward and a request for bids is due this month. This project includes installation of classroom doors with required vision panel and safety closures for lockdown purposes.

Board members discussed the proposed bill and effects on the District's budget.
